A God-sized dream


We want to share our video resources with Bible teachers everywhere

After a decade of listening to pastors and other Bible teachers, Experience Israel Now is tackling its biggest dream ever.

We're building a website/app that will allow pastors, small-group leaders and Bible teachers around the world to use our photographs, video clips and drone video footage in their own ministries.

"BibleStock.org" will allow anyone to type in a Scripture passage and immediately discover several ready-to-show video clips, photos and illustrations that will help them bring visual content into their teaching.

If the concept catches on, thousands of Bible teachers could soon be using our unique video resources. Did you know that we have more drone

video footage of biblical sites than any other organization?

It will take several months to build the site and have it ready for use. It will also require a great deal of marketing once we're ready to launch.

Discover. Download. Play. Easy.

Nearly without exception, pastors love the idea of using visual images from the lands of the Bible in their own teaching ministries.

Unfortunately, almost none of them are using such resources!

Last winter, a focus group of pastors helped us clearly define the challenge of how we might equip more Bible teachers with photos and video clips from the lands of the Bible.

The results of our study tell us that pastors are too busy to tackle the time-consuming task of learning how to incorporate video into their sermons. They don't know how to make video clips. They don't know where to find such resources. And just as important, they don't know what to say about biblical locations while a video of that site is playing.

Our goal is to eliminate those challenges with a new website/app we're calling "BibleStock.org."

Visitors to the site will type in a passage of Scripture or a biblical location. Video clips, photos, and illustrations related to the search will immediately appear. "Talking points" will be available, too.

From there? It's a matter of downloading the video and dropping it into any presentation software common to all computers.

Almost all Bible teachers have projectors, screens, television monitors, laptop computers and smart phones at their disposal. Now they'll have images from the land of the Bible to use as God leads!





A few weeks ago, I was teaching a class on Bible geography to seminary students at Ambassador International University in Zambia.

Technology has taken its time to reach AIU. When I was there in 2019, the school only had power 12 hours each day. This year? We had electricity around the clock!

Despite the limitations, we challenged these students to learn how to use Google Earth Pro and to incorporate

video clips from biblical locations in a presentation to their classmates. They would *show* one another how geography helps us understand the Bible.

For several years, this is something I've longed to see more pastors and small-group leaders do in America, where we have an abundance of technology.

The students at AIU immediately caught on to the new teaching technique. Though some of them needed more help than others, I came away with a major realization.

It's time to share our visual resources with the world. If it works in Zambia, it'll work anywhere!



And we need an extra \$100,000. It's a Godsized dream and it's requiring the biggest stretch of faith for our ministry since we began full-time work in 2015.
